

Short Excerpts Taken from *Pope Francis Speaks to Families Words of Joy and Life*

From Whom Did We Receive Our Faith?

No one becomes Christian on his or her own. If we believe, if we know how to pray, if we acknowledge the Lord and can listen to his word, if we feel him close to us and recognize him in our brothers and sisters, it is because others, before us, lived the faith and then transmitted it to us. We have received the faith from our fathers, from our ancestors, and they have instructed us in it. If we think about it carefully, who knows how many beloved faces pass before our eyes at this moment: it could be the face of our parents who requested our Baptism; that of our grandparents or of some family member who taught us how to make the Sign of the Cross and to recite our first prayers.
